Projects in Minnesota may be started at any time during the year. However, if the project is to be shown at a county or state event, certain requirements must be met. Each of the requirements listed pertain specifically to state events.

- A. For leased animals, a lease form must accompany the identification form.
- B. Rabbits: Fryers must be identified on Minnesota 4-H Rabbit Ownership Affidavit.
- C. Please note that birds that come to State Fair must be from the same flock of the same breed and variety as your county fair winners, but you may select different birds for the State Fair than those that were exhibited at the County Fair. Rule of thumb suggestions for State Fair hatch dates are: 1) breeding poultry and waterfowl (includes duck, turkey, guineas & geese)~ January 1 or later, 2) market poultry except market chickens ~ March 1 or later, 3) egg production chickens (white or brown egg layers) ~ March 1 or later, 4) market chickens show best at 8-10 weeks of age ~ 4-H'ers may need two hatches to accommodate County and State Fair.
- D. Minnesota 4-H does allow for family ownership at the time of identification. “Family” is defined most commonly as brothers and sisters. It may also include other youth whose guardianship is the same as the brothers and sisters. Projects need to be “personalized” to the individual 4-Her at the time of ID verification at the county fair or State Fair qualifying event. In other words, at the time of ID, market animals may be ID’ed by the John Doe Family. But, at the time of verification at the county fair or State Fair qualifying event, each project exhibited must be “declared” by a specific sibling. So, at the checkpoint, the project must be “declared,” for example, by either Billy Doe or Missy Doe. From that checkpoint forward, the project must be exhibited by the “declared” 4-Her. This ownership policy does not allow for the same animal to be identified by two different 4-H families. As an additional point of clarification, the same animal MAY NOT be identified by cousins; unless the cousins are members of the same immediate family unit (guardianship) as described above.
- E. Dairy Goats: If a 4-H member has started their dairy goat project with a goat(s) prior to first freshening and continues with the goat(s) for two years (through freshening of the goat(s) if appropriate) they then may purchase or lease goats that have been through first freshening.
