Division C

1. Read these rules twice before making entries.
2. Entries will close July 30, 2009. Please send entries and fees to Richard Timm, 40285 506th St., N. Mankato.
3. The entry fee is \$1.00 per bird. Entries are limited to two birds in a class. Classes: (1) cock-male bird hatched in 2008 or earlier; (2) hen-female bird hatched in 2008; (3) cockerel-male bird hatched in 2009; (4) pullet-female bird hatched in 2009.
4. Premium will be paid on all varieties recognized by the American Standard of Perfection, considered worthy of premium by our judge.
5. A health certificate is required for all poultry except duck and geese.
6. This society will not be responsible for any loss or accident. The stock

- will be carefully tended to and every possible precaution will be taken to prevent damage or loss.
7. During the exhibition, entries will be in control of this society and cannot be removed without its consent.
 8. Band your birds for your own protection.
 9. Birds may be entered from Wed., Aug. 12, 4 - 8 p.m. - Thurs., Aug. 13, 8 - 11 a.m.
 10. Ribbons are awarded to third place upon request.
 11. Judging will be Friday, Aug. 14, after the 4-H judging.

SPECIAL RULES

1. Exhibitors please read the general rules.
2. Exhibitors are welcome to exhibit any new vegetables or fruits that are not already listed. If 2 or more entries are received for the new category we will create a new lot for them. For podded vegetables, bring twelve (12) specimens; for larger vegetables, bring four (4) specimens; Berries, bring 1 cup; Fruits, bring five (5) specimens.
3. A plate of apples or pears must consist of exactly five (5) specimens; grapes, four (4) bunches; crab apples, six (6) specimens; plums, five (5) specimens. Not more than one plate of any variety will be allowed in any one lot.
4. Specimens may be added to any sample except while judging is in progress on the lot, to replace those which have deteriorated. The superintendent will see that any deteriorated exhibits are removed.
5. All exhibitors must grow their own exhibit.
6. 4th-, 5th- and 6th-place ribbons will be awarded when merited.
7. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion will be awarded in each division.

Overall Reserve Champion-\$5.00
8. Champion and Reserve Champion placings with premium will be awarded in the following areas:
Division E: Class I-II Division F: Class III
Division E: Class III-IX Division G: Class I-III
